Please consider the following guidelines for our LEEP Day:

- Safety is always paramount!
- 1. Report any health/safety/injury issues to Education Committee ASAP!
- 2. Students (and staff) always wear life preservers when in canoes or on the water. Canoes work in pairs.
- 3. Wear safety glasses for tree boring module
- Come to the outdoor your site early to familiarize yourself with your study area and survey for hazards or unique teaching opportunities
- Check to make sure you have all the required equipment...especially safety equipment like safety glasses, life preserves, etc.
- Maintain security. Insure that no student is left alone (count you students) and don't be alone with a single student anytime
- Watch your time and try to complete your module on schedule
- Report any of your concerns or recommendations to the *Education Committee* to help improve the program
- Please let a member of the committee know ASAP if you are unable to attend so we can cover your area of responsibility

Mr. Arthur's 7th Grade Eco-Field Trip, Tuesday, May 14, 2013 Itinerary

Directions: Take County Road N to Barnes, cross HWY 27 go to T, turn left (east) on County Road Y go 6.8 miles to East Mail Road on left ("Y Go By" Grill on right side of County Rd. Y). Turn left onto East Mail road and proceed forward to second left turn which is #13920. (First left is "Sunny Shores Dr.") Turn left down driveway and follow it to a large parking area by a covered pavilion.

8:45 Load Bus and Depart from Drummond Middle School to Andresen/Eastlund property; 13920 East Mail Road, Gordon

9:15 Arrive

9:20-9:30 Instruction on rotations, safety, lifejackets, etc. (Introduce possible plankton viewing opportunities throughout the day.)

 - 1. Macro Invertebrates
 - 2. Tree Study
 - 3. Shoreline Restoration and Reforestation
