October 4, 2016 – Sunny, breezy, 70°. We picked Swiss chard and the last of the green tomatoes. Still about 40 apples on the Frostbite tree. How blessed we are to have this beautiful place to come too.

October 7, 8 & 9, 2016 – It was a cool but beautiful fall weekend. Highs around 50° and lows around 30. On Friday we had brightly colored dahlias and inpatients thriving in the planters on our deck. On Sunday they were all wilted from the first killing frost of the year. It was one of the latest dates we could remember that flowers bloomed into October. Oh how lucky we are.

This morning the baby loon was still on Sweet lake, along with five geese and three ducks.

The leaves are past their peak and most have fallen off the trees.
