		have come in recently. Some members paid in December or January and again in May after the newsletter came out. Stewart is contacting the members who have paid twice; most have instructed her to use the duplicate membership as a donation. She noted that next year we will want to try to minimize duplicate payments to cut down on the time the Treasurer spends processing these receipts.
	Expenditures vs. Budget	Our memberships and donations are well ahead of last year, although we will likely still be spending some reserves this year due to increasing FOECLA's funding for the Town's invasive species efforts. Some expenditures have increased – such as the cost of the newsletter – although others may decline. For instance, we awarded only \$1,000 of the \$2,000 earmarked for scholarships for high school seniors.

	June Report	Paker reported we're doing a better job with our overall messaging to members. As of June 6, we have 274 memberships, resulting in \$18,470 in membership contributions and \$6,077 in other contributions, for total contributions of \$24,547.
